ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

First Reading

Resolution No. 2613-21

A Resolution authorizing the city of Urbana to request, apply for and/or receive its designated share of funds from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and further authorizing the Mayor, Director of Administration, Director of Finance, and other appropriate City official and personnel to take necessary actions, and declaring an emergency.

Mrs. Boettcher advised that the purpose of this resolution is for the authority for the City to apply for, receive, etc. the 2.2 million dollars that have been set aside for the City of Urbana. She also stated that the first installment of \$1.1 million is to be received by the end of this year, and the second installment of \$1.1 million is to be released 12 months after the first installment. She also mentioned that the funds received must be expended or encumbered by December 31, 2024, and that all work and final payments to vendors/contractors must be completed by December 31, 2026. She said that the eligible uses were Public Health/Negative Economic Impacts, Premium Pay, Revenue Loss, Investments in Water, Sewer, and Broadband. She also advised that this Act was more forward thinking in nature. Also, by Council approving this Resolution, it will allow the City to register to receive the funds and that it was federal dollars and as such, must be put into a special fund for its purpose.

Mr. Thackery asked what "Premium Pay" meant. Mrs. Boettcher stated that it was for first line responders, hazard pay, etc.

Mr. Paul stated that it wasn't free money.

Mrs. Collier asked if new restrooms could be covered, for she felt the City should be responsible to provide restrooms. Mr. Crabill stated that it could go toward any project that the City would take through the OEPA.

Mr. Scott asked if it could be used on the South Main Street Project. Mr. Crabill stated that it was on the table for discussion.

Mr. Fields moved to put this Resolution on the floor for further discussion and possible passage. Mr. Thackery seconded.

President Hess called for a roll call for passage: Mr. Paul, yes; Mr. Scott, yes; Mr. Thackery, yes; Mrs. Collier, yes; and Mr. Fields, yes.


