City of Urbana Shade Tree Commission Minutes – September 9, 2021 at 7:00PM (166)

Roll Call and Introductions:

Present: Jim Lemon, Doug Crabill, Ward Lutz, Stephanie Truelove, Colin Stein, and Doug George

Absent: Charles Moody

Reading and Approval of Minutes (7/8/2021)

The minutes from the July 8, 2021 meeting were approved as prepared. Ward Lutz motioned to accept these minutes, and Jim Lemon seconded this motion. This set of minutes were approved unanimously 6-0.

Old Business:

Maintenance and Trimming Projects: Jim Lemon reported that he and Doug George trimmed some limbs from trees in treelawns that were overhanging sidewalks on Boyce Street and Lafayette Avenue.

Memorial Tree Program Update (Update Listing & GPS/GIS Update): Doug Crabill reported that efforts continue to update all Memorial Tree records into the city's GPS/GIS system to include multiple database fields, including Latitude/Longitude coordinates.

Oak Dale Cemetery-Arboretum Update: Doug Crabill reported that he hoped to submit the accreditation application to ArbNet (Morton Arboretum) for certification of Oak Dale Cemetery as a Level 1 arboretum soon from the draft application that Kerry Brugger had put together.

Karen Kerns Dresser Donation (Naming & Sign): Doug Crabill stated that Kerry Brugger was now working with a manufacturer in the Cleveland area who specializes in markers that are cast from bronze or aluminum. The proposed concept is to add a sign below the Oak Dale Cemetery entrance sign that would be similar in material and style. In addition, Kerry Brugger has developed a landscape plan to replace the Arborvitae that were recently removed around and near the existing entrance sign at Oak Dale Cemetery.

Policies and Procedures (Administrative Regulation): Doug Crabill explained that the Shade Tree Commission will need to continue to develop policies and procedures that will address items not specifically addressed by the tree ordinance. Wooster, OH has a great example of policies and procedures. Potential policies include removal, owner planted trees, road/right of way blockage, reasons to warrant removal, planting/site preparation, and tree canopy goals. Kerry Brugger previously provided a draft document for a process flow for tree removals based on tree inventory results for review/evaluation by the commission. Doug Crabill shared that he would be working with other city staff to develop a notification process to initiate tree removals where needed by property owners.

Mulching: Doug Crabill reported that remaining mulch would be utilized during planting efforts later this fall or it would be used to mulch any newer trees that had not been mulched previously.

Watering: Doug Crabill stated that the mulching efforts earlier in the summer had helped to mitigate stress caused by the newer trees drying out. Coupled with adequate rainfall, no supplemental watering has been required so far during the summer months.

2021 Street Tree Inventory: Jim Lemon reported that he would like to update the street tree inventory for 2021. He also indicated that he plans to note areas where topsoil is needed from previous stump removal work.

Bareroot Trees (Spring 2022): Doug Crabill that he had continued to correspond with Don Creamer in Washington Court House, and he is still trying to secure a new source for bareroot trees.

New Business:

Fall 2021 Memorial Tree Program: Doug Crabill reported that applications are being accepted for the 2021 Memorial Trees to be planted later this fall. In addition, he shared that a press release had been published in the *Urbana Daily Citizen*. Also, he emphasized that the planting would be completed before Thanksgiving this year to ensure that the efforts could be counted towards the city's Tree City USA application. Lastly, the commission discussed a resident's concern regarding the placement of a tree at the Old Graveyard at East Ward Street and North Kenton Street.

Misc. Business: Doug Crabill shared that an Urban Canopy Restoration Program grant was being made available through the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. Based on the information required for a successful grant application, the commission determined that a program application was not feasible at this time.

Meeting adjourned. Motion to adjourn, Jim Lemon; Colin Stein, second; all in favor (6-0).

ORDINANCE NO. 4554-21

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A STATEMENT OF SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED TO TWO PARCELS CONSISTING OF APPROXIMATELY 2.030 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, IN SALEM TOWNSHIP PROPOSED FOR ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF URBANA BY THE PETITIONERS, DAVID M. OELKER AND DOUGLAS T. OELKER, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with the Champaign County Commissioners on October 12, 2021 by the petitioners, David M. Oelker and Douglas T. Oelker, for annexation to the City of Urbana, certain real estate in Salem Township designated in Exhibits "A" & "B" hereto; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 709.023 (C), Ohio Revised Code, the City Council is required to adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the City will provide to the territory proposed for annexation within twenty (20) calendar days of the petition's filing date; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, OHIO:

SECTION ONE:

That, with respect to the territory proposed for annexation aforesaid, the City of Urbana will provide such services as are otherwise provided to incorporated areas of this City in accordance with applicable contemporary law, practice, custom, regulation and resources. The services of the City of Urbana currently include, but are not limited to, police, fire, ambulance, repair and maintenance of publicly dedicated streets, zoning, access to existing municipal water and sewer lines and service as well as general municipal government.

SECTION TWO:

These services will be provided starting on the date that the annexation is recorded with the Champaign County Recorder's Office which is also the effective date of the annexation. Municipal water and/or sewer will be provided at the established outside city rate until the effective date of the annexation.

SECTION THREE:

That, with respect to the territory proposed for annexation aforesaid, the City of Urbana hereby consents to the proposed annexation, and the City of Urbana agrees to provide

services as outlined in Section One of this ordinance on the effective date of this territory being annexed into the City of Urbana.

SECTION FOUR:

This ordinance is hereby declared an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare by the provision of municipal services to the territory for annexation. The reasons for such necessity are the established timeframes established in Ohio Revised Code for this annexation process. Therefore, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect.

ORDINANCE NO. 4555-21

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO LAND USE AND ZONING BUFFERS FOR TWO PARCELS CONSISTING OF APPROXIMATELY 2.030 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, IN SALEM TOWNSHIP PROPOSED FOR ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF URBANA BY THE PETITIONERS, DAVID M. OELKER AND DOUGLAS T. OELKER, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with the Champaign County Commissioners on October 12, 2021 by the petitioners, David M. Oelker and Douglas T. Oelker, for annexation to the City of Urbana, certain real estate in Salem Township designated in Exhibits "A" & "B" hereto; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 709.023 (C), Ohio Revised Code, the City Council is required to adopt an ordinance relating to land use and zoning buffers for territory proposed for annexation within twenty (20) calendar days of the petition's filing date; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, OHIO:

SECTION ONE:

That, with respect to the territory proposed for annexation aforesaid, the City of Urbana hereby finds that the existing residential use of this territory is compatible with surrounding land uses, but Salem Township's Zoning Map indicates that this territory is zoned B-1 which does not align with present land uses within and adjacent to this territory.

SECTION TWO:

That, with respect to the territory proposed for annexation aforesaid, the City of Urbana shall reserve the right to rezone the territory to maintain compatible land use in the territory proposed for annexation in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1113 and Part 11 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Urbana after the annexation process has been officially completed. Furthermore, this territory shall be subject to municipal zoning regulations once it has been designated on the Official Zoning Map of the City of Urbana.

SECTION THREE:

That, with respect to buffering for incompatible land uses, no buffering shall be deemed necessary at the present time as current land uses within this territory shall be deemed compatible with surrounding land uses.

SECTION FOUR:

That, with respect to buffering for incompatible land uses, if the Salem Township does not update its Zoning Map for parcels adjacent to this territory proposed for annexation to be more consistent with the existing land uses in this area, any proposed business uses that may develop adjacent to the territory proposed for annexation shall be properly screened from adjacent residential uses.


SECTION FIVE:

This ordinance is hereby declared an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare as it relates to land use planning for the territory proposed for annexation. The reasons for such necessity are the established timeframes established in Ohio Revised Code for this annexation process. Therefore, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect.



RESOLUTION #2618-21

A RESOLUTION SETTING RULES FOR THE SALARY COMMISSION

WHEREAS, Section 4.06(k) of the Charter of the City of Urbana, Ohio creates a Salary Commission, which shall consist of five members who are registered electors of the City appointed by the Mayor subject to the confirmation by Council by resolution; and

WHEREAS, Section 4.06(k) allocates to the City Council the responsibility to set any rules for the commission beyond that contained therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, the COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, OHIO does hereby impose the following additional rules upon the Salary Commission:

- 1) The Salary Commission shall submit their findings and recommendations to the City Council for review and consideration. Upon receipt thereof the City Council shall, using its authority to appropriate funds, put the proposed changes to a vote.
- 2) Council may accept or reject, in whole or in part, any and/or all of the Commission's recommendations and findings.
- 3) Council shall consider for acceptance or rejection, in whole or in part, findings and recommendations as to the Mayor, the Council President, and/or the Council members separately and individually.
- 4) A majority vote of Council shall be required to accept any findings and recommendations of the Salary Commission.
- 5) Any changes in the salaries approved by the City Council shall take effect commencing with the ensuing term of that affected elected official. Such changes shall be set at least 5 days prior to the last day for filing for candidacy and salaries may not be changed during the term.
- 6) Council reserves the right to supplement these rules with any additional rules they deem just and proper from time to time, but they shall provide them no later than thirty (30) days prior to the Salary Commission's first meeting of the year.

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this City Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this City Council in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
